

Miles



Miles Hall is named for **Clarence Paul "Sally" Miles**. Born in 1879, he was a Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College and Polytechnic Institute graduate in 1901 and earned a master of arts degree in 1903.

During his tenure at the college, he held various roles. First, he served as a professor in chemistry from 1901-1903. Then he served as a professor of modern languages from 1903 to 1920 and from 1935 to 1956. Miles also served as athletic director from 1921 to 1935. As athletic director, he helped found the Southern Conference in 1921. He was the football coach in the 1905 and 1906 seasons (his overall record was 14-3-2). He served as graduate manager from 1908 to

1911. In addition, he was dean of the college from 1943 to 1949. He was named professor emeritus upon his retirement in 1956. He died in 1966.

The original football stadium, Miles Stadium, was named for him. It was razed in 1964 to make way for additional residence halls and a bigger stadium.

Residence hall built: Miles Hall was completed in May 1964.
